



Patient Consent To Resuscitative Measures

**** PLEASE BRING WITH YOU TO YOUR SCHEDULED APPOINTMENT****

NOT A REVOCATION OF ADVANCE DIRECTIVES OR MEDICAL POWERS OF ATTORNEY

Under California law, all patients have the right to participate in their own health care decisions and to make advance directives or to execute powers of attorney that authorize others to make decisions on their behalf based on the patient’s expressed wishes when the patient is unable to make decisions or unable to communicate decisions. Summit Surgery Center (SSC) respects and upholds those rights.

The majority of procedures/surgeries performed at SSC are considered to be of minimal risk.

Surgery Patients:

Of course, no surgery is without risk. You and your physician will have discussed the specifics of your surgery and the risks associated with your surgery, the expected recovery and the care after your surgery.

Pain Patients:

Injection procedures are generally considered to be low risk. However, complications can occur although serious complications (permanent nerve injury, disability or death) are extremely rare. Some complications which result from injection procedures include the following: bleeding from the injection site, increased pain, temporary numbness or weakness of an arm or leg, bowel or bladder dysfunction, headache, dizziness, hot flashes, difficulty sleeping, difficulty breathing, infection or spinal meningitis and allergic reactions to medications. You will have the opportunity to ask questions regarding the procedure and possible complications prior to the procedure.

It is the policy of SSC, regardless of the contents of any advance directive or instructions from a health care surrogate or attorney in fact, that if an adverse event occurs during your treatment at SSC, the personnel at SSC will initiate resuscitative or other stabilizing measures and transfer you to an acute care hospital for further evaluation. At the acute care hospital further treatment or withdrawal of treatment measures already begun will be ordered in accordance with your wishes, advance directive, or health care power of attorney. Your agreement with this policy by your signature below does not revoke or invalidate any current health care directive or health care power of attorney.

If you do NOT agree to this policy, SSC will be pleased to assist you to reschedule the procedure.
